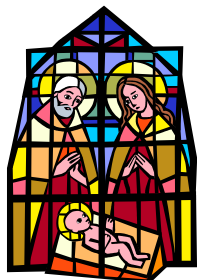

"I have fun learning at school because I have a new teacher and friends. My best subject is science. I am good at Math. My favorite sport is soccer. I play piano and I am good at it.

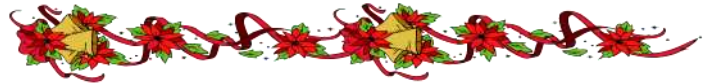


### ADRIANA SMALL
